26 DECEMBER

Lift up the pastors who have struggled to share the good news of Jesus during the various lockdowns. May they be strengthened and speak boldly about what it means for each one of us. Pray that CHI will be able to provided more Bibles next year.

JANUARY

VOCATIONAL TRAINING - Not every child is an academic, and learning practical skills through vocational training is vital to enable them to provide practically for themselves and their families. The skills learned are also a valuable resource for the community. Unfortunately the training centres are often poorly funded as they are not seen to be as important as mainstream schools.



02 JANUARY

Give thanks that there are practical training opportunities that can offer a path for those that are not academically gifted.



09 JANUARY

Pray for the students who have not had the opportunity to train whilst the centres have been closed, that they will be able to resume their courses and have hope for a better future.



16 JANUARY

Give thanks for the church run Vocational Training Centres and pray for donations to be made towards the equipment needed to support the training.



23 JANUARY

Please pray that God has watched over the buildings whilst they have been closed, that they will not have deteriorated badly, or been subject to theft or vandalism .



30 JANUARY
